

# In The Shadow Of The Poorhouse: A Social History Of Welfare In America

In the examination of "race and IQ," "patterns of black excellence," and "ethnic and immigrant education," Sowell does make use of "historical" evidence. These data tend to undercut the current assumptions about the meaning and significance of intelligence tests scores. Thus, to undercut racial interpretations of the fifteen-point difference in IQ scores between black and white students, Sowell examines evidence demonstrating as large or larger differences historically between white immigrant minorities and middle-class Americans. He also identifies several separate black educational institutions that produced high levels of student academic achievement before the official desegregation of American public schooling beginning in the 1950s. The historical data demonstrate that racial and ethnic minorities of low socioeconomic status did manage to achieve high levels of academic performance in some separate public and private schools. This occurred despite de jure and de facto segregation; however, rather than undercutting assumptions about the negative consequences of segregation, Sowell's research documents one of the unintended positive consequences of public educational systems designed to keep minorities "in their place."

There is very little in this volume of significance to historians of American education, the title notwithstanding; however, as a source of information on conservative interpretations of current educational policies and practices, Thomas Sowell's collected papers are a very good place to begin.
